Improving Our Environment Is Everybody's Job

- [1] In the past, many people liked to think that life existed on other planets in our solar system. It was an exciting thought. Perhaps we had friendly neighbors out there. Perhaps we had enemies. Today we know that we have no neighbors in our solar system. All the planets have been explored by space robots. According to the scientific information, no planet but Earth has the air, water, and vegetation necessary for life.
- [2] Earth has the best position among the nine planets that revolve around the sun. Neither too near nor too far from the sun, it receives the necessary amount of heat and light. High up in the air, the ozone layer protects us from the sun's dangerous rays. As Earth revolves, the seasons change. Winds blow rain clouds over the land, and our fields are green with vegetation. Without this special environment, there would be no life on Earth. If we change this environment, we may destroy some of life's treasures.
- [3] Earth was formed over 4 billion years ago. At first it was a dead object of rock, like the moon now, without air or water. It took millions of years to develop into a world of life. Now Earth is the home of over 13 million different plant and animal species. All the varieties of living things depend on the sun, on air and water, and on each other. The sun will shine for millions of years. Will we be able to keep Earth a special place in the solar system?
- [4] The future doesn't look bright. Environmental problems have harmful effects on our health and on all of nature. We may observe these problems at home with our drinking water, at the beach where garbage floats in the ocean, in our polluted rivers and streams where fish can no longer live, and on our farmlands and woodlands where acid rain falls. Scientists warn us that our problems will get worse. In some parts of the world, whole forests are being cut down. As a result, wildlife species become homeless and may even die out. Moreover, scientists predict that, without our forests, Earth's climate will change. They say that the continued use of fuels such as coal and oil will add to the climate problem. These fuels and other chemicals pollute the air and slowly destroy the ozone layer that protects us from the sun's dangerous rays. This will result in higher temperatures, droughts, and severe storms all across the globe.
- [5] Can we live on our land without spoiling the environment? In the United States the federal government owns large areas of wilderness. This land is managed by the National Park and Forest Service to provide recreation for the public without upsetting the balance of nature. To keep these areas unspoiled, the Service limits the number of people and cars in the parklands. Park attendants patrol the forests to clear out firewood left by campers because deadwood makes the soil poor. They try to prevent fires by watching closely for danger signals. They control noise and air pollution from boats on the lakes and rivers. They have strict rules to protect the animals in the forest from harm by visitors, and to protect the visitors too.

	[6]	The National Forest Service also manages Echo Lake, a vacation community in the Sierra Nevada Mountains of California. There are only 125 cabins on the lake because the Service wants to prevent overcrowding. Cabin owners cannot have electricity or flush toilets. They cannot chop down trees for firewood, and they cannot dig up rocks to add space to their cabins. They cannot burn or bury their garbage. They must carry their garbage out by boat. To protect the lake from pollution, the Service forbids powerboats; residents must use sailboats, rowboats, or canoes for transportation.					
	[7]	Chemicals in soaps and detergents can also pollute the lake, so the cabin owners must have a special drainage system for wastewater. One owner was letting her soapy sink water drain into the lake. When this was reported, the Service directed her to dig a dry well, a huge hole under her cabin. The hole is filled with rocks and sand. The dry well filters the dirty water through the rocks and sand. Then the water flows cleanly into the lake. When the woman completed the job, the Service was satisfied that she had followed the rules. Cabin owners on Echo Lake must take great care of everything in their daily lives, but they also enjoy a healthful, pleasant environment.					
	[8]	Echo Lake is a vacation community, and, unfortunately, most of us can't take part in it. However, in our crowded cities, in our industrial world, in the lands of wild vegetation and animals, we cannot go on with irresponsible activities that will lead to the further destruction of nature. No one wants the Earth to become like the planet Venus—a world of carbon dioxide, acid rain, and 900° temperatures!					
	[9]	Stories about the future—in books and in movies—show people living on other planets, on the moon, or in space. But Earth is our real home, our only home.
